

Prince Philip Hospital



Prince Philip Hospital is located on the outskirts of Llanelli, in easy reach of the M4 motorway and coastal relief road. The hospital is on bus routes, including a link from the railway station.

Benefiting from a new 'front of house' investment,

the hospital has an Acute Medical Assessment Unit and Minor Injuries Unit. The hospital provides comprehensive General Medicine services, Elective General Surgery, Urology and Orthopaedic services.

Trainees and Medical Students have access to a fully functioning Clinical Skills Lab. There is also a programme of simulated patient scenarios.

Prince Philip Hospital / Llanelli area has achieved excellence in:-

- The Wellness and Life Science Village at Delta Lakes, Llanelli, is part of ARCH (A Regional Collaboration for Health) in partnership with Swansea Bay University Health Board. The initiative covers the whole of South West Wales and will benefit a million people.
- A Rapid Access Lung Cancer clinic

Hospital Accommodation

All Foundation Doctors in Wales are offered free hospital accommodation for the duration of their Foundation Year 1.

In the unlikely event that there is no accommodation available, there is a possibility of you being able to claim expenses.

Below we have briefly outlined the accommodation that is available within this Health Board:-

- The accommodation for Foundation doctors is sited in the designated residential blocks which are in close proximity to the hospital and Medical Education Centre.
- Single rooms are provided, but there are some flats for married accommodation which may be available to rent, subject to availability.
- Each block has flats with four bedrooms sharing a kitchen and bathroom. Some rooms have en-suite WC and showers.
- There is a carpark for residents' use on the hospital site.
- The Doctors Mess has Sky TV, Wifi and a kitchen area. There is a monthly charge to cover the facilities.

The trainee will benefit from regular consultant ward rounds and bed side teaching that will build knowledge and clinical reasoning. All members of the team are encouraged to seek out educational opportunities in particular attending outpatients to both observe and see patients themselves. Specialist clinics run regularly in PPH including complex IBD, Liver disease comprising of viral hepatitis and post liver transplant follow up alongside general gastroenterology referrals. There will also be an opportunity to attend the endoscopy department to observe both Upper and lower Gastrointestinal endoscopy which will include therapeutics, and all trainees are expected to complete the attachment being competent in performing abdominal paracentesis. Alongside their usual ward duties the junior doctor will also be part of the general medical rota and have the opportunity to see acutely unwell medical patients being admitted to the acute medical assessment unit while being a part of the Medical emergency Team (MET) and attending acute stroke thrombolysis calls.

This post will introduce the doctor to the full range of rheumatological disorders through attending 4 outpatient clinics per week, the rheumatology day unit and seeing ward referrals with one of the 3 rheumatology consultants. There will be the opportunity to develop specialty specific procedural skills such as therapeutic intramuscular, intraarticular injections, and soft tissue injections depending on the preference of the doctor. Blood results from clinics will be the responsibility of the doctor to check daily and any unexpected abnormal results can be discussed with the clinician who last saw the patient in clinic. There will be time to become familiar with drug counselling and monitoring, prescreening investigations for DMARDs and biologic therapies and to develop knowledge about chronic disease management. IT skills can be developed through the use of our electronic patient record and communication skills, by the doctor seeing patients in clinic and then presenting their findings to the consultant who will then see the patient with the doctor. There will be time during the week for a quality improvement activity, or case study to be done. There is an on call medical rota commitment and engagement with weekly junior doctor teaching, journal club and grand rounds will be encouraged.

Most of the procedures will be for diagnosed Breast Cancer patients with a minority being related to cosmesis and benign conditions. The Junior Doctor will be expected to be in the ward by 8am and be part of the Ward Round. They will be involved in pre-assessing patients prior to the surgical procedure. They will also be expected to attend theatre to assist in the basic resection breast surgical procedures. They will attend clinics in which new patients with a breast problem are assessed.

They will present in at least 2 journal clubs on a Thursday afternoon and complete one audit. There will be no on-call commitments related to breast surgery. The usual working day ends at 4:30pm.

Our department is well staffed with junior doctors which allows ample opportunity for foundation doctors to attend outpatient clinics and spend time in the operating theatre.



In addition to gaining the generic competencies required of all doctors we encourage our trainees to improve their experience of outpatient management of common ENT conditions, and many Foundation doctors have been able to start a logbook of surgical cases they have been involved in. This time in theatre stands them in good stead when applying for further training jobs. A significant proportion of our patient group is aged under 18 which provides paediatric exposure for those doctors considering a career in paediatric medicine or general practice.

GGH is a busy district general hospital which admits general and specialty trauma from across the entire health board. 350-400 hip fractures are admitted per year. There are 2 F2 doctors, 8 Trust grade core trainees, and a surgical scrub practitioner on the SHO level rota. There are 10 middle grade doctors, including 2 higher surgical trainees and 11 consultants undertaking a 1:8 on call. We have strong links with Swansea and Cardiff universities and encourage involvement in research and quality improvement activities. The F2 is an integral part of the Cardiology team in GGH, working with an F1, Clinical Fellow/IMT/ANP (2 posts) an SPR and a specialty doctor. The team is led by 4 cardiologists who provide daily input to the wards and CCU. The team look after 6 patients in CCU, 6 in the cardiac step-down unit and 10 on Towy Ward (with occasional outlying patients). The junior doctors are given the opportunity to spend time gaining experience in ECG interpretation, basic echocardiography, basic pacing and angiography. More senior doctors are trained in some of the advanced techniques and the junior doctors are encouraged to develop a better understanding of these.

F2s take part in a 1:11 on-call rota where they will be on-call with either an F1 or F2 and a middle grade. A 'twilight' doctor helps in the evenings. There is also a night nurse practitioner on at night to support. There is a consultant presence from 8am-8pm Monday to Friday and for much of the weekend. There is always a consultant on-call from home who is available 24/7.

The F2s are supported to attend educational events in the postgraduate department and are given careers advice and support from the consultants. They are also supported to fulfil the curriculum requirements.
